
## HALLOWEEN WAS THE THEME FOR THE OCTOBER MEETING

car for the next nice day.





## DON'T LET JACK FROST NIP YOUR "A"

Attention Model A brothers and sisters: Don't forget to winterize your "A"s cooling system. Either by draining the A's radiator of all water or by adding antifreeze (50-50 mixture) to the A's cooling system. Failure to do so may result in cracked radiator tubes or cracked engine block or both. Also, don't let your A end up with a broken heart. Check

her battery for full charge. The specific gravity should be 1.275-1.300. A battery at 1.160 will freeze at 0 degree F & a battery at 1.120 will freeze at 20 degrees F.
