### DIXIE HIGHWAY HERITAGE

Since French fur trade days, Momence has always been an important crossing on the Kankakee River, which is relatively shallow at this point. After the arrival of the earliest settlers, a bridge, in one form or another, has crossed the north and south channels of the river here. For decades, the Dixie Highway crossed the south channel of the Kankakee River on the two-span steel skeleton bridge (left) built by the Massillon Bridge Company in 1886. Prior to construction of the new bridge



(right) in 1938, the old bridge was moved slightly west and

continued to serve as the temporary crossing for the Dixie Highway until the new bridge was completed.
