

A quick reminder: For all of us advancing in age and seem to need a little help in getting into the car, try to avoided the use of the steering wheel as an grab handle. This pressure on the steering support yoke on the bottom of the tank will start cracking the solder in the tank covering the rivets and a gas leak will occur in your car. When this happens removal of the tank is necessary to stop the leak. Phil and now Al have had to remedy their leaks by first having the yoke re-welded and then sealing the tanks. 
Camp Quality 08/04/2009


