

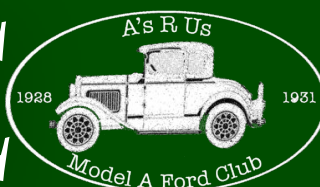

Well, it doesn't feel so bad now that it is finally getting colder and there is a light dusting of snow on the ground. When it stayed warm for so long, I just wanted to get the A out of storage and drive it. But with so little heat coming off of the manifold heater, I'm ok now with keeping the A in the garage. I am putting together my list of items I wanted to add or change out this spring. New engine pans, LED taillights and work on the stain on the back seat. I'm sure that we all have a list of to do's. It will be long and we all will be checking off our lists. Every day that goes by is another day closer to driving time.



While digging through the parts catalogs, I came across an idea that sounded interesting. Last summer I used only water in my radiator and did not add any rust inhibitor. When I winterized the car in the fall I saw that the water was rusty. I know that some of this rust is probably clogging-up my radiator. The idea I came across was to use one of Connie's old nylon stocking to make a cooling system filter. Drain about a gallon of water/coolant from the system and remove the upper radiator hose. Insert the stocking toe down into the hose a few inches. Next lip the upper section of the stocking over the hose and reattach the hose to the radiator. Trim off the excess nylon material. And refill the radiator. When the car is started the water will carry the stocking up into the radiator and act as a filter. They tell me the filter will catch allot of junk. I am going to give it a try.

I am looking forward to our spring trip to the Gilmore Model A museum. I saw the agenda for the grand opening celebrations. Saturday is a full day and we, along with hundreds of other model A'ers, will get to park our cars near the Museum and enjoying the live music, garage works tours and historic lectures. 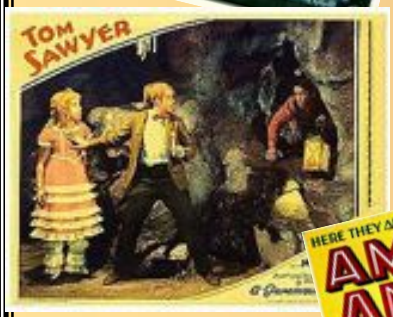
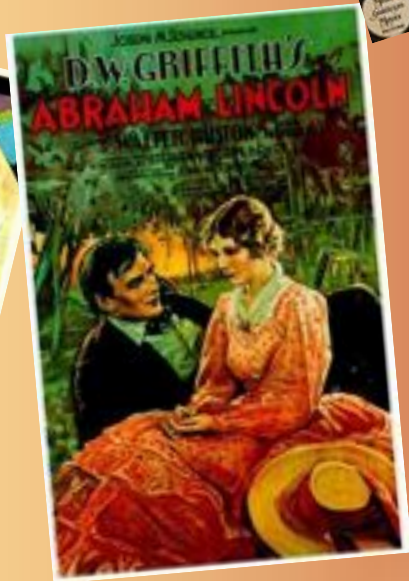

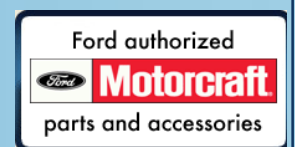

“Michi gami” Circle Tour

1,100 Mile Odyssey

September 7 – 14, 2013



The Lake Michigan Circle Tour route is the culmination of innovation and hard work by visionary Jack Morgan of the Michigan Department of Transportation. Just 14 months after Morgan introduced his Circle Tour concept in 1987, agreement to designate and fund it was reached between the governors of Michigan, Wisconsin, Illinois and Indiana. In 1998, the route was mapped and signs were posted along all 1100 miles of Lake Michigan's shoreline.



I am in the planning stages of the tour now and plan to split up the tour with a new lead car every day of the trip so everyone gets to enjoy the lead as well as following. The route will be finalized in the next few months as well as the stops for the night. As lead car you will have your route for the day well in advance of the trip and have the pleasure of finding attractions you may want to stop at along the way.

DIXIE HIGHWAY HERITAGE

The Dixie Highway passes through 10 states. Indiana was the home to Carl G. Fisher, the man who first proposed the Dixie Highway at the end of 1914. Fisher, an entrepreneur from Indianapolis, was the head of the Prest-O-Lite Company, makers of automotive headlamp systems, and was also an organizer of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. In 1913 he was instrumental in garnering support for the Lincoln Highway and he used this experience to promote the Dixie Highway.

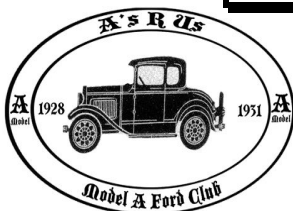
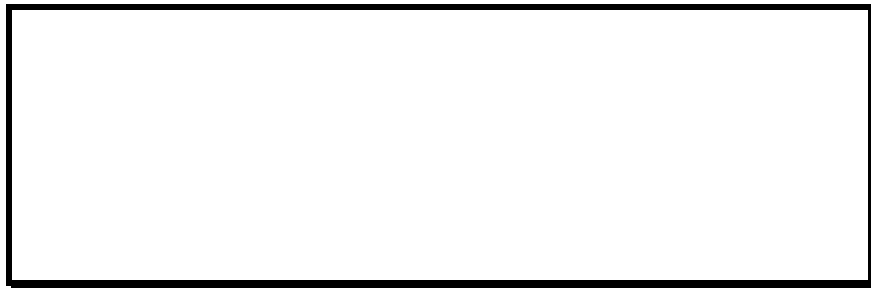
