INCORPORATION.....


We are officially incorporated as of January 1997.

JUST HOW COLP WAS IT?

When I first saw this ole' girl, I fell in love with her. I told the professor, "I'll buy 'er" After I loaded the "A" on the trailer, I asked if it had antifreeze in the coolant syste. The 'know everything' professor says "Sure, all of my cars have antifreeze". I replied, "very good".

I drove home with my prize and parked her in the barn. I put her right next to my 1930 Tudor Model A. Boy, they looked like they belonged together. Then I thought I would check the antifreeze with my hydrometer. Lo and behold, something must be wrong with my hydrometer. It indicated the coolant was only good for 20 degrees F. So I drained the questioned coolant into a bucket. I left the block and radiator drained.

On January 17th, I thought I'd better check on my babies, since it had been so..o.o cold. I pulled

the bucket out from under my "A's" engine and guess HOW COLD it was? Yes, colder than a well digger's "A". The coolant was FROZEN SOLID.

So heed Ricochet's past experience, NEVER take the word of a "know-it-all". CHECK YOUR OWN ANTIFREEZE or your "A" might crack it's block!

MODEL A KNOCK & ROLL By Ricochet

Don't mistake a spark knock for a loose bearing.

Spark knock usually occurs when you suddenly accelerate or climb a hill with the spark fully advanced.

Slightly retard the spark and the knock should be eliminated.

A loose bearing knocks all the time when the engine is running regardless of spark advance position.
