Our next Club outing will be a trip to Tommy Gun's, a nostalgic night out on the town. At the next meeting we will finalize these plans, so until then...remember the password.




combination, don't you think?).



CARE OF TIRES



Tires should never be run partially inflated, as the side walls will suffer unnecessary stress. The rims may also cut the tire bead. The tires on your Model A should be inflated to 35 pounds. Tire pressure should be checked during your regular maintenance, or whenever one looks low on pressure.

Never drive on a flat tire. Tire, tube, or rim damage could occur.

Hard braking, causing skidding, will shorten tire life.

Use caution when parking next to curbs, bumping or rubbing damages tire sidewalls. Keep your A;s tires clean of all oil and grease. These are the main destroyers of tires.

If your A will be stored for a long period of time, you should jack it up to eliminate the weight on the tires.
