DIXIE HIGHWAY HERITAGE

In April 1924, Sears Roebuck and Company established its own radio broadcasting station under the call



letters WLS (World's Largest Store). For a time, the station broadcast out of studios at the Sears headquarters near downtown Chicago. The radio station quickly became a success and, in the spring of 1925, Sears purchased 4 acres on the Dixie Highway just south of Crete to erect powerful transmission towers. The towers and a station building broadcast the WLS radio signal until



1938, when the transmitting facilities and tower were moved to Tinley Park near the intersection of I-80 and Route 45 where they remain today. For years the old station building served as an office for a trailer park. The building has since been demolished and the acreage once owned by WLS is now a part of Queens Estate Trailer Park.
