The Danville Soldiers' Home was opened in October 1898 as a residential facility for disabled soldiers and sailors. The home was located on Main Street, about 2 miles east of downtown Danville. A total of 31 "members" were living at the home at the end of 1898 and, at the height of the facilities' operations over 20 years later, "membership" had increased to about 4,000 residents. The sprawling complex included beautifully landscaped grounds and amenities such as a band shell, auditorium and theatre building, chapel and fountain. Today the Veteran's Administration Medical Center and the Danville Area Community College occupy the grounds and remaining buildings. The facility was a stop on our 2010 Fall Tour.

Man drops off 1,580 rolls of Kodachrome film as developing comes to an end

December 30th, 2010



Thursday, the last developer of Kodachrome film in the world will discontinue developing the film; people around the world used Kodachrome film for 75 years and it was the first colored film that became a success. And in true procrastinator fashion, one man waited his whole life to develop all of his film...1,580 rolls of it at the same time during

the last week that the film will ever be developed. Dwayne's photo in Parsons, Kansas has received orders from all over the world over the last few weeks after announced in 2009 that they would stop developing Kodachrome film on December 30, 2010. Dwayne's photo still develops approximately 700 rolls of film per day, but Kodak is discontinuing the chemicals needed to develop the film. A famous song from 1973 was written about Kodachrome film, and there is a national park in Utah called Kodachrome that was named after the film as well, according to CBS News. The increase in the use of digital photos has lessened the use of Kodachrome film, even though photographers say that Kodachrome film still has the best color. Dwayne's photo has numerous incredible stories of people who want to have their film developed before they can no longer do so. A railroad worker from Arkansas dropped off his 1,580 rolls of Kodachrome film in the last week and paid \$15,798 to have it developed. A woman from London flew to Kansas to drop off three rolls of film and said she will shoot five more rolls and bring them in before



the December 30 deadline, reported the New York Times. Dwayne's photo plans to shut down the Kodachrome processing machine and sell it for scrap.
