
We are on Facebook now thanks to a suggestion from a club member. Just search for "Model A Ford Club" on Facebook and, "Wa La" A'sRUS will pop






Service station architecture in the 1920' and 1930's blended well into residential environments. This quaint cottage-style station was built in 1933 on the northwest corner of Ridge Road and the Dixie Highway in downtown Homewood. Shell brand oil and gas products were sold here for a few years until the station rebranded and Sinclair products were offered until 1979. Jack Kurtz, station owner for over 40 years, is pictured. A newer structure replaced this building on the site in the late 1950's.

Using Tim Borchert car for demonstration, he was able to get a free valve adjustment.

After removing the carburetor, the oil return pipe, and the valve cover, we were ready to get started. First we removed the spark plugs, so turning over the engine was easier. It doesn't matter what valve you start with, Just need to remember which one.

I usually number the valves, eight through one starting at the back of the engine. We started with the number eight valve.

- Crank the engine over until you see number one valve at its highest point. This is usually when you can see the two flat sides of the lifter body. They will stick about 1/4 inch.
- Now number eight will be on the bottom and you can measure the gap. The reason of eight and one is, that the two numbers equal nine.
- On Tim's car we found number to be over 35 thousandths gap. It should have been 14 or 15 thousandths.
- Now rotate the engine so number eight lifter is on top and number one on bottom.
- Now adjust number eight and measure number one.
- Now then move on the any of the next lifters, but keep in mine that the numbers must equal nine.
- Valve 7 and 2 = 9
- Valve 6 and 3= 9
- Valve 4 and 5 = 9
- Doing the adjustment this way keeps you from having to remove the head
- and measuring the piston height, each time you rotate the engine.

The adjustments went well on Tim's car. Once we quieted down the lifters from sounding like a typewriter, we could then hear a nasty little guy beating away inside his engine. Try as we might, we could not seem to locate that little guy. We left that problem for a later date.

The next morning, I received an Email from Tim.


When he got home and turned into his driveway. He developed a horrendous grinding and screeching noise. After he got the car into the garage he wrote a Email explaining what happened. So I hooked up the trailer and went to see what was what.

Joe, who had rode home with Tim, thought it was something in the flywheel housing So I pulled the starter and went fishing. First time I caught a bendix washer. So using a big glob of old time bearing grease stuck to the ring gear. We went fishing again. This time we came up with that nasty bolt. There was only about half of the bolt left. It had been ground up pretty good.

We put the starter back on and test-drove his car on a nice bumpy rode. No more screeching. But, boy that little guy inside with his hammer was playing a tune. We took it back to the shop and finally got the rpms just right, so he was hammering all the time. The only place I could really hear it good was in the timing cover. We had reinserted the timing pin the night before, pushing the gear to see if the timing gear was loose or not. It sure didn't seem to be. So I pulled the timing cover and that's when I found the bugger. He was missing a few teeth from the gear. So I had to replace his timing gear. When I got it off and counted all of the teeth that were missing I came to the total of fifteen missing teeth. With the new timing gear installed, she sound more like a Model A should.

So for the five guys who showed up for the tech talk, thanks for coming. I had an enjoyable time and I hope someone learned how to adjust their valves.


