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






In Illinois the Dixie and Lincoln Highways intersect in Chicago Heights, the "Crossroads of the Nation." Currently, the roads cross at the intersection also known as U.S. Route 30 and Illinois Route 1. From 1915 to 1928, the Lincoln Highway shared the same alignment as the Dixie Highway south of this intersection to Sauk Trail, where the Lincoln Highway then traveled east into Indiana. In 1928, the Lincoln Highway was rerouted to the present alignment, which bypasses "downtown" Chicago Heights to the north. In Indiana, the Lincoln Highway has also traveled across two different alignments over the years. The 1913 alignment arced north through South Bend and La Porte then down to Valparaiso. The 1928 alignment traveled a more direct path across the state from Dyer, through Valparaiso and Plymouth to Fort Wayne. On this routing, the Lincoln and Dixie Highways cross in downtown Plymouth, a stop we will make on our tour along both highways in September.


Homewood Parade-July 4, 2012
