

I will try to also shorten the business meetings so that a small tech talk and or






Join US on the Spring 2015 Trip

This year we are venturing to LeClaire, Iowa. A vintage town lying right alongside the Mighty Miss, LeClaire offers much more than the site of American Pickers headquarters. A vibrant and quaint riverside downtown with lots of shopping, both boutique and antique, as well as restaurants and watering holes it is a step back in time. Other adventures include the Buffalo Bill Museum (his homestead is 12 miles north) as well as an authentic paddle wheeler.


The dates for this A's R Us Spring Trip is May 15th through May 17th. The trip is being planned by Jon and Ron and we have driven it one time already. Our hotel is chosen, the Comfort Inn and Suites in LeClaire with a block of 20 rooms (Kings at \$123 and Doubles at \$113 which includes hot breakfast) is set up. In the 1920's Milford, Illinois offered free camping and "every convenience to the tourist" in the town's park located on Route 1/Chicago Street - the Dixie Highway - just south of the village's business district and adjacent to their school grounds. Motorists were encouraged to "make this a point on your trip."

Today, the campgrounds are gone and the land is now part of the school athletic fields. Milford though is home to a more unusual landmark on the Dixie Highway, a Republic-Ford JB-2 "Loon", which was the United States' version of the German V-1 flying bomb, also known as a Nazi "buzz bomb." According to local historians, this World War II unmanned aircraft was given to the town's American Legion as a war memorial after World War II. A history of Milford relates Legion members showed up at Chanute Air Base in Rantoul, Illinois to pick up a suitable piece and were offered a full-size bomber.



Fearing this was too big; they were directed to the JB-2 instead, which was hauled back to town. It sat on the school grounds on Route 1 for years, painted in U.S. colors. In the 1970s, someone saying he was from Wright-Patterson Air Force Base showed up, claimed he was there to get the aircraft restored and took it away. When townspeople checked up, they found there was no record of this person or their "Loon" at Wright-Patterson. It later turned up at a private museum in Harlingen, Texas, and was eventually brought back to Milford, where it remains prominently displayed on the Dixie Highway.

It was proposed we donate 4 cars with drivers/couples, to pick up winner couples and we treat them to the ride and brunch. Jim noted this donation could cost between \$160 to \$200.00.
