Flying on the Dixie

Airports were a prominent feature along the Dixie Highway in Markham during the 1930's through 1950's. The Dixie Airport was the first to be built and it opened in 1934. A small "port," it served the general aviation needs of the south suburbs. The airport was located on the west side of the Dixie Highway between 163rd and 167th Streets. The Dixie Airport gained notoriety in 1938 and 1939 when Willie "Suicide" Jones,





African American wing walker and professional parachute jumper, used the airport to attempt to set a world record for a delayed parachute jump. After attempts in August and November 1938, Jones achieved an official air-leap record on March 2, 1939. His jump was measured at 24,468 feet by a barograph provided by the National Aeronautical Association and the U.S. Bureau of Standards certified the official results. Two years later, this record would be broken, this time by a jumper at Markham's second airport, the Rubinkam Airport, but more on that next month.


