

Watseka: Thriving city grew from a trading post on the Iroquois River


Watseka is named in honor of the Potawatomi princess "Watch-e-kee", or "Daughter of the Evening Star". She was the daughter of Shabbona, who was one of Tecumseh's trusted lieutenants. Watch-e-kee was also the first wife of early Illinois settler Gurdon Saltonstall Hubbard. Hubbard, a young fur trader with John Jacob Astor's **American Fur Trading Company,** arrived in eastern Illinois in 1818. He set up trading posts between Chicago and Vincennes, Indiana and the route between these became known as Hubbard's Trail. One of the trading posts he established was on the Iroquois River at the west end of what is Smith Street today in Watseka. A monument marks this spot. Hubbard's Trail was the forerunner of the Dixie Highway and Illinois Route 1.

Since its early days, Watseka has been a transportation hub. In 1858 the Peoria and Oquawka Railroad, later the Toledo, Peoria & Western Railroad, built its line east from Peoria to the Indiana state line. The route was surveyed through Middleport, a settlement just west of Watseka, but a dispute arose in that town regarding donating land for the depot grounds. A group of land owners to the southeast of Middleport proposed an alternative location to the railroad. This offer was accepted, and the rails were eventually laid south of Middleport. A new town, initially called South Middleport, was established. The name was changed in 1865 to Watseka; and upon incorporation of Watseka in 1867, Middleport was annexed into it.


In 1871, the Chicago, Danville & Vincennes Railroad, later the Chicago & Eastern Illinois (C&EI) Railroad, began service from Chicago to Vincennes with a depot serving Watseka. Watseka and Iroquois County residents then enjoyed through north-south and east-west passenger and freight rail service. In addition to the Dixie Highway, the Corn Belt Route, now U.S. Highway 24, was another early paved highway that bisected the county.


Watseka is the seat of Iroquois County. In area, Iroquois County ranks as the third largest in the state. The county is 35 miles long and 32 miles wide and contains 1,120 square miles, only 130 square miles less than the state of Rhode Island.

Watseka has figured prominently in Illinois Dixie Highway history from the beginning. On July 14, 1915 Congressman Joseph "Uncle Joe" Cannon of Danville, who was speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives at the time, turned the first shovelful of earth just south of Watseka, east of the county farm, ceremoniously signifying the start of improvements on the highway in the state. A crowd estimated at over 10,000 people attended the event in a parade of automobiles said to be 3 miles long!

Today Watseka remains the economic, governmental and transportation hub of Iroquois County.


Upcoming Events:
