Please remember we have, once again, been invited to attend the Cedar Lake Yacht Club's annual corn roast on September 3rd. That is the Sunday before Labor Day.


There will be a charge for the roast but as in the past it is very nominal. Wally and I will have the

"Party Barge" pontoon boat available for rides on the lake.





