DIXIE HIGHWAY HERITAGE

In September 1921, Cook County had 12 deputies patrolling all of the roadways in the unincorporated sections of the county, which covered quite a substantial area at that time. This caught the attention of the Cook County board, which in short order authorized the establishment of the Cook County Highway Police under the direction of the sheriff. A force of 74 highway deputies was

authorized and, by February 1922, thirty-one deputies were on patrol and by the summer of 1922 the remainder were patrolling the county's roads.



The highway police duties not only consisted of handling traffic violations, but they were also involved with investigation and handling of all criminal activity in the unincorporated parts of the county. This was no small task. The highway police were established after the enactment of Prohibition, and the rural areas of the county were rife with nefarious activity related to the "rum-running" gangs so prevalent at the time.

To provide coverage for the whole county, the highway police divided it into 3 districts. District 1 consisted of the northern



sections of the county and the district and highway police headquarters were located in a handsome 3-story brick building built for the purpose in 1923 on Milwaukee Avenue in Niles. District 2 deputies patrolled the central sections of the county and their headquarters were located in a small building that some say was once a bowling alley and was located on Archer Avenue in Willow Springs. District 3 covered the southern sections of the county and their headquarters were in a small frame building located on the Dixie Highway, a little over a block south of 175th Street in

Homewood. A converted rail car served as the lock-up and was located next to the station which was situated on the east side of the highway, just west of the rail tracks.





Homewood's highway police deputies worked out of their Spartan headquarters until 1937, when a new building was built for them on Ridge Road, just west of Halsted Street. The building still stands and is used as the E-COM 9-11 Dispatch Center. E-COM is the intergovernmental agency that provides police, fire and emergency medical services (EMS) dispatching to over 105,000 residents in the villages of

Homewood, Flossmoor, Glenwood, Hazel Crest, South Holland, Riverdale and the city of Country **Club Hills. The Cook County Highway Police** became the Cook County Sheriff's Police in 1952 and the Homewood station closed at the end of 1975, with consolidation of operations into the sheriff's new headquarters building in Maywood.
